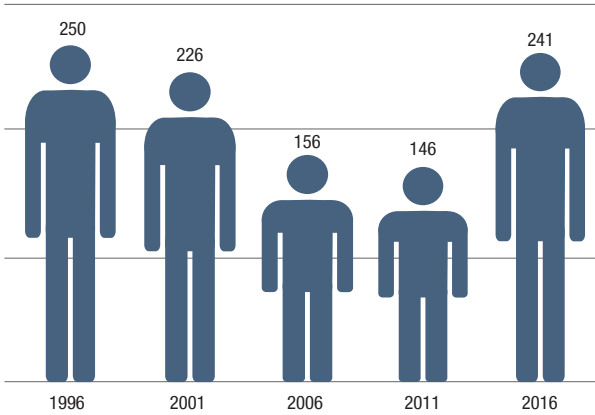


BROCHET

Brochet is a Northern Community originally established as a Hudson Bay fur trading post on the western edge of the province, beside Barren Lands First Nation on Reindeer Lake. Accessible by air and winter roads, the region is important for trapping and commercial fishing.

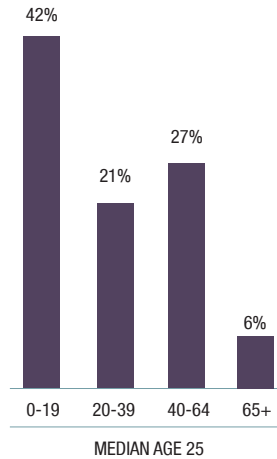
POPULATION CHANGE

2016 Median Age = 25



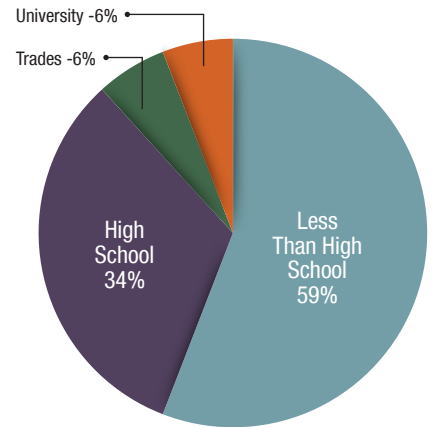
POPULATION BY AGE

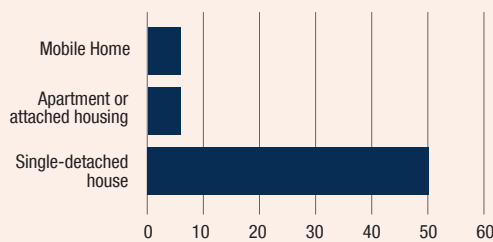

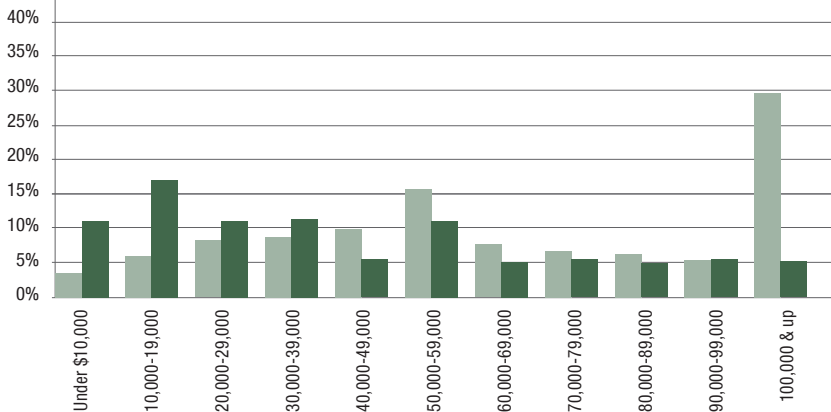

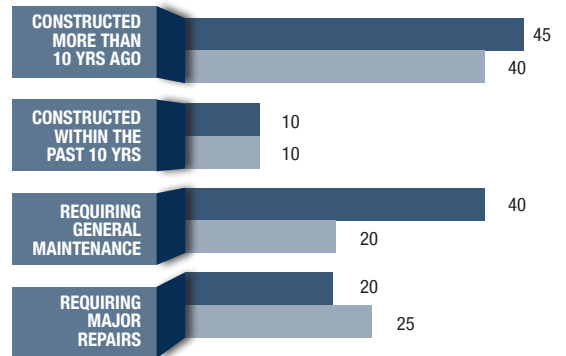

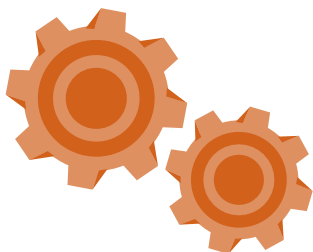

(GROWTH OF OVER 10 JOBS FROM 2006-2016)

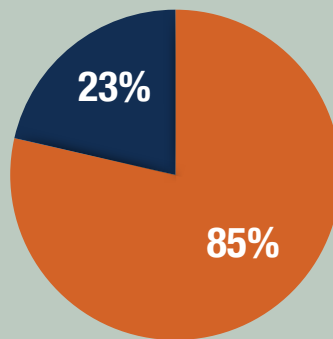

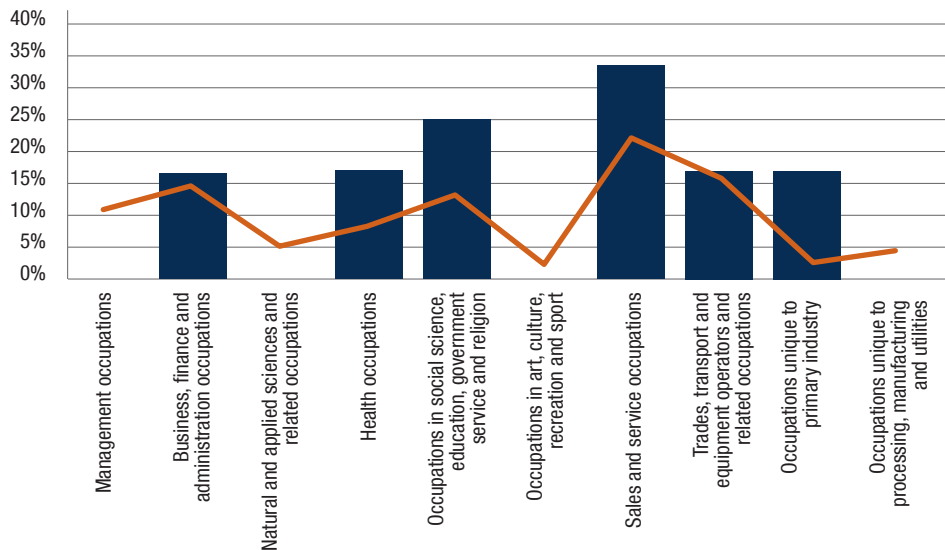

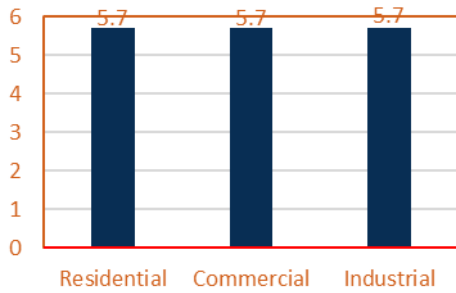
WATER/WASTEWATER
